Frome's long history with the textile industry began with the first fulling mill recorded in 1349. With its access to the river for vital for processes such as dyeing and nearby grazing fields for sheep, the town was a hub for creating cloth that was sent around the world. Local workers were known for their blue hands, stained by the natural dye 'woad' grown in the surrounding fields.

The Silk Mill was last used as a working textile mill one hundred years ago, finally closing in 1926. It currently homes many creatives in its studio spaces and is a successful event venue.


