He was an assistant – or so it is said.*
T. R. Hannaford (Railway station shed builder was assistant to Brunel)
4. *Ten is the number as onward you march,
But what, underneath, is the height of the arch?*
4.8 m (15 ft 9 in) (On railway bridge crossing Wallbridge)
5. *Take a western route to find this weight,
All the words on the sign please can you state?*
"Warning. Laden weight not to exceed 12 Tons. Network Rail." (If you follow Great Western Street until it almost reaches Rivers Reach you will see a small track heading north to a bridge which crosses the railway line)

Alice Seeley, Lady Harris – Malmesbury (Near entrance to Silk Mill)
14. *This hydrant will douse almost any fire,
The number above – is it lower or higher?*
Lower (Number 5, near The Iron Gates, Kingsway)
15. *Which house is found here, do you feel?
It could be a card game, but it's no big deal.*
Bridge House (No. 2 at corner of Bridge St and North Parade)
16. *Signs like this are all over the place,
But behind which building can this one be traced?*
Frome Museum
17. *A store that's been here for many a year,
I hope you can grind out the answer here.*
Miller's (In Westway precinct)
18. *Train your thoughts upon this sign,
And tell me which destination you'll find.*
Railway Station 20 minutes (At entrance to Scott Rd)
19. *On stony ground you might embark,
And tell me where you might make your mark.*
Sirens Tattoo Parlour (No. 9 Stony St)
20. *Beyond the castle for your next bounty,
Have you gone too far? Are you in the wrong county?*
Wiltshires Barton (Cross Castle St and go into Trinity St)

21. *What goes on here? Have cuts been made?*

The street you are in has a different trade.

Butcher's Shop (Meat cuts made on Baker St)

We're hoping you'll give us the name of a saint.

St Catharine of Alexandria (Catholic Church on Park Rd. Correct spelling, please)

What's the time and the date to stay on the lead?
